
Enjoy Our NEW and FREE WatchTVEverywhere Service

What is WatchTVEverywhere?

It's a free service available to subscribers of qualifying Jefferson Telecom TV packages. With WatchTVEverywhere, you can watch some of your favorite channels and programming — including live TV and full episodes of current TV shows — on your tablet, smartphone, or laptop.



You can use WatchTVEverywhere anywhere you have an internet connection.



How do I get started?

The first step is to complete a one-time registration. To aid in this process, have a recent Jefferson Telecom bill on hand to access your account number highlighted in yellow.

- Go to www.watchtveverywhere.com and select Jefferson Telecom in the drop-down menu.
- Click the Register link.
- Complete the registration form.
- Check your email. You will receive a message with an activation link.
- Click on the link to complete the registration process.

What's available on WatchTVEverywhere for me to watch?

Once logged in to the site, click on the TV network you want to watch, and you'll see a list of available WatchTVEverywhere programs.

You can watch any WatchTVEverywhere program as long as it's on a network you subscribe to through your Jefferson Telecom TV package. Please be patient — channels available via the WatchTVEverywhere portal will be slowly added over the next three months. Making Social Media Safer for Kids

Today's children are growing up with social media, which can be both positive and negative. Social media for kids, as for adults, is a means for connecting with others, self-expression, game playing, and exploring new interests. But for kids, it can also be a source of bullying, ill-intentioned adults, and inappropriate information.

Boundaries and Rules

The key to ensuring appropriate use of social media for kids is educating them about what it means to be a good digital citizen. Yet many schools have yet to implement such training, and some parents aren't able to provide guidance because they're still trying to figure out the digital world themselves.

In order to stay safe with social media, kids need to understand the basics of privacy, boundaries, appropriate sites and interactions, and how much time to spend online. In other words, kids need to be given rules such as, "Never agree to meet someone in person who you've only communicated with online," "Never swear online," or "Spend no more than one hour per day online." Rules usually go over better if kids are given the chance to help set them.

Parental Participation

Another factor in keeping kids safe with social media is your own participation. You can set a good example by limiting your time on social media sites. You can also help keep your kids safe by limiting the visibility of photos of them to people you know well and trust. You can monitor your kids' social media interactions by friending them on social media sites, checking their profiles, and reviewing their friend lists.

There's No Need to Scream When You See Scareware

Scareware is a particularly underhanded form of malware that causes fraudulent warning messages to pop up on your screen. These messages tell you something is wrong, or something bad is about to happen, and that you must immediately take a specific action to make it stop.

For example, scareware may tell you your computer is infected, and you must download certain software in order to remove the infection. Or it may say your credit rating has been jeopardized, and you need to pay for a service to restore it. The price tag for the solution is usually a small one, which makes the scam even more believable.

When scareware works, it scares you into following the message prompts and paying for the software or service that promises to clear the error. In the best-case scenario, you've paid for a worthless service. In the worst case, however, you've downloaded more malicious software to your computer, or you've provided your credit card information to criminals.

Scareware is so common, most of us will run into it at some point. If you do, don't be scared. Stay calm and follow these steps:

1. Close the browser.

The first thing to do when you see a suspicious alert on your computer is close the browser window without clicking anything on the popup.

If the popup is preventing this, instead open your task manager (Ctrl + Alt + Delete on PC, and Command + Option + Escape on Mac) and shut down your browser from there. If this still doesn't work, shut off your computer. When you start your computer again, don't open your browser until you've completed the next two steps.

2. Run a virus scan.

Once you've closed your browser completely, run a virus scan on your computer using your installed security software.

3. Make sure your operating system is up to date.

Run any pending system updates, then reboot your computer afterward if it doesn't reboot automatically.
